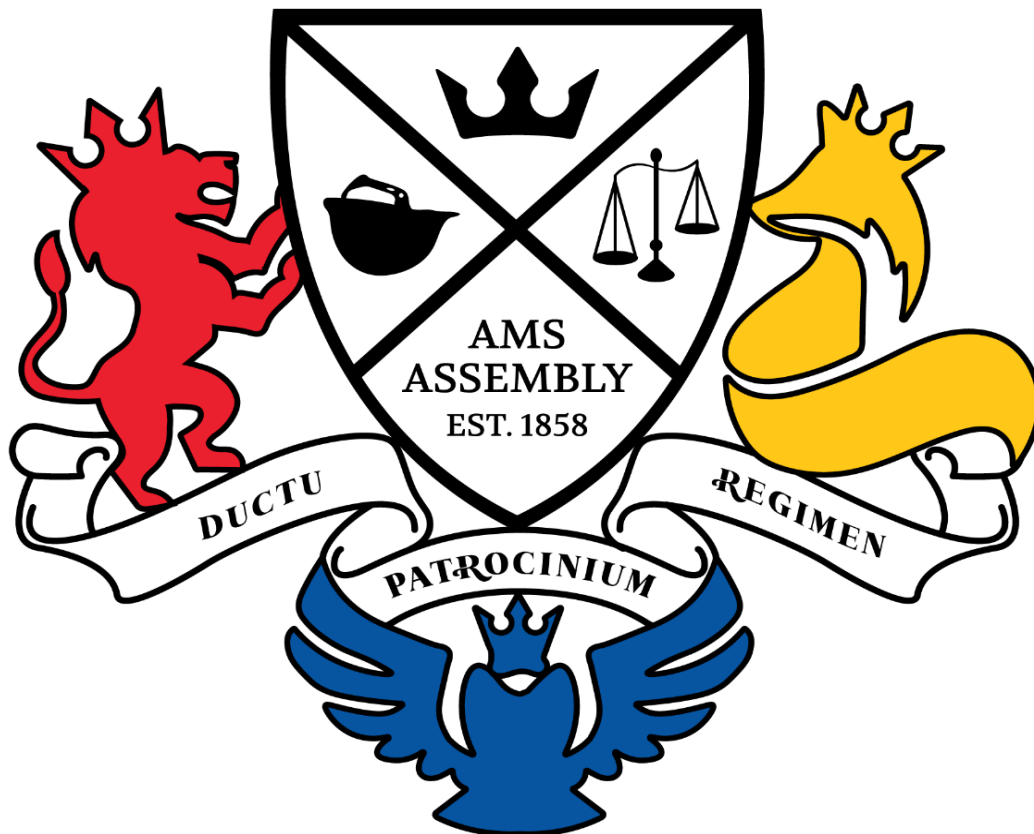

What an exciting time to be a leader in student government with all of our students soon returning to campus. These next few weeks will be an incredibly busy time, but with hard work will come great reward. Under the VPOPS umbrella, all hiring for the school year has been completed by each of the services. Head Managers and Chiefs are now gearing up for volunteer/staff/supervisor training in preparation for the student return to campus. Please see below for service specific updates.

Common Ground Coffeehouse/The Brew | The Brew held its soft launch on August 12th and 13th, and was met with great success and positive feedback. Alex is currently finalizing transition for the incoming Head Manager, Caleb, who will begin on August 30th.

Society 58 (formerly Tricolour Outlet) | Tricolour Outlet has officially launched their re-branding to Society 58. This re-brand aims to better reflect students on campus, leading the service to a newer, more connected and modernized operation. Tatyana and her team are focusing their efforts on ensuring Society 58 has successful student engagement with the return to campus.

AMS Media Centre | The Media Centre team has developed an MOU with the AMS Marketing Office for the 'AMS Asks U' series. The team is focusing on several creative projects, and are planning ahead for sidewalk sale in September.

Queen's Pub Restaurant & Bar | The Queen's Pub is focusing their efforts on getting staff training organized. All staff will be attending a training session hosted by the AGCO (Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario) to ensure the Pub remains a lively and safe environment when students return to campus. The team has also begun hosting trivia nights, be sure to stay in the loop to attend one!

Queen's StuCons | The StuCon team is currently gearing up to attend several orientation events. The team is also focusing on ensuring all staff have received relevant trainings prior to their start date, including First Aid, Smart Serve, and security licensing training.

Walkhome | The Walkhome team is currently integrating a new software that allows for SMS messaging when patrons have requested a walk. This software will provide an enhanced student experience for those utilizing the Walkhome service. Planning for TBTN continues, and the official date for the event is set to be on September 19th. Niki is currently

looking for volunteers for the event. If you are interested, please reach out to walkhome@ams.queensu.ca.

Peer Support Centre | The new PSC Head Manager, Randy, has officially assumed the role. He is currently focused on finalizing staff training and hiring a new Queers 4 Peers Assistant Manager.

Foodbank | The Foodbank team is currently seeing the largest number of patrons to date as food insecurity continues to rise on Queen's campus. Caroline and her team are focusing their efforts on accommodating as many patrons as possible, while also organizing the opening of PEACH market in September.

Queen's Journal | The Queen's Journal have spent the past few weeks re-locating to the Queen's Centre. The team is gearing up for their next press release on August 29th, be sure to grab a copy from one of the several newsstands on campus and stay up to date on student news!

Bus-It | The Bus-It agreement has been officially signed off on by both the AMS and the City of Kingston. With the new agreement, the City will be implementing several planned improvements and seasonal service adjustments to enhance service for current and future students.

Consolidated Budget | The 2025-26 consolidated operating budget is currently underway. I look forward to presenting the final consolidated budget at a future Assembly session.

Hello Members of Assembly,

I hope you are all doing well. The past month has been relatively quiet on my end as I was away on vacation, several important developments have taken place across the commission.

The **AMS Events Policy** has now reached the consultation period. This is a key milestone in the policy's development, and feedback at this stage will help ensure that it works effectively in practice. I **encourage you to share any suggestions or observations from your own event-planning experiences so that the final version is both practical and reflective of the needs of all groups it impacts.**

On the staffing front, we have welcomed two new members to the team: our **International Affairs Director** and **Special Projects Director**. Both bring strong experience, creativity, and a genuine passion for student engagement, and I am confident they will be instrumental in helping us advance our priorities for the year ahead. One of their early focuses will be supporting the planning of large-scale events, such as the **ORT Mystery Concert**, which, following its move to the CAC, is being integrated into the commission's responsibilities. We have been working to ensure the event is accommodated within our existing framework while maintaining the high standards and smooth coordination students expect.

Another project nearing completion is the **AMS Equipment Borrowing Program**. With the support of Commissioner Schmidt, the program is expanding to include a wider range of supplies, from cutlery and serving equipment to projectors and tech accessories, so that students and clubs can run events without unnecessary financial strain. The program will launch in full at the start of the year with a simplified booking and pick-up process, making it both accessible and efficient.

Finally, preparations have begun for this year's **Harm Reduction campaigns**, which will explore the intersection of Indigenous harm reduction principles and current AMS practices, with the goal of integrating these perspectives into our ongoing initiatives.

I look forward to providing further updates as these projects progress.

Additionally, strides have been made towards the implementation of the **Menstrual Equity Project** in the JDUC, especially with its grand reopening. By the start of September, we hope to have temporary menstrual product baskets in each of the single user washrooms, stocked with help from the Peer Support Centre and in conjunction with the dispensers currently in the female-identifying washrooms.

I've also had a chance to meet with many of the Faculty Society Equity Commissioners/Officers across both undergraduate and graduate societies, and I'm really excited to see where **Equity Caucus** will lead this year. I'm hoping that this continues to be a space for equity student champions to network, collaborate and discuss our collective advocacy priorities throughout the year.

I've really enjoyed all this work thus far, and I look forward to seeing it all come together in the next months. Good luck to all of you, and happy beginning to a new school year!!!

Hello Presidents!

I am wishing everyone has had a happy and fun summer while also balancing your roles. For this past month, the board has finalized all unit budgets, consolidated funds, and other financial budgets for the fiscal year. The final consolidated operations budget is to be approved at the August board meeting. As well this month I have secured and coordinate the following trainings of KPI Fundamentals and Services and Programs Planning Session for the Strategic Planning Committee, a CPA Risk Resilience Symposium for Finance and Risk Committee, the ESG Fundamentals for Investments Committee, as well for Student Director training and onboarding ensuring sufficient trainings and resources for student directors is working with the Canadian Not for Profit Academy on a NFP Student Board Onboarding Modules. Additionally for BoD training is planning with Ethica Solutions a Transparency and Communications session, that is to explore how shareholder transparency and communication can be effective and important in corporate governance in effort of this year improving board to student communications. Lastly, for Professional development, training, and onboarding is the PI Index session with the student directors. Lastly, for other updates outside of Board meetings, is the Website for the board page will be updated to reflect current information by end of September.

Board Meeting:

Our most recent board meeting continued to work through the to be reviewed HR policies and approved reviews brought through personnel committee, we also completed budget approvals, and first draft of the publishable copy of the Strategic Plan. For the upcoming board meeting we will cover remaining summer business, continue with further policy updates, and approve the Fall Governance Calendar. If anyone has any questions or inquiries about our board meetings, or requests of session minutes, feel free to reach out to myself, the secretariat, or the Vice-Chair of the Board Eshal Ali (board.vicechair@ams.queensu.ca).

Committees:

This month for committees we have operated as per compliance of our Board policy manual, the Finance and Risk Committee, Personnel Committee, Governance Committee, Investments Committee, and Strategic Planning Committee meetings which have met once and worked on their years projects.

Personnel has continued to work on HR Policies for review, develop the restructuring manual, and initiate the Student Director Honorarium review committee as per Board By-Laws that will be made up of all outgoing directors.

The F&R Committee has wrapped up committee review and feedback for the procedure and framework for Risk Management, with the Chair of the Board and Chair of F&R working

with the General Manager to develop an updated draft Framework procedure to be more formatted to match other policies and more consumable to student leaders. Further, the Chair of the Board has begun Risk Investigations with the permanent staff which has concluded, the fall will conclude for the Executive and Board Risk investigations.

The Investments Committee Chair and Board Chair has drafted and brought to committee for feedback period on the Investments Policy Statement that is reviewed and updated again for matching formatting, wording for addressing current economic challenges, and assurance/reinforcement of our non-investment of energy sector investments.

The Governance Committee has wrapped up the SAF Brief that has been gone over with direction on any remaining steps for assuring all review committees, JCOMM decisions, and Assembly committee recommendations were officially adapted alongside review of the legislative changes. Governance Committee has also been with the Vice-Chair and Chair of the Board overseeing the progress of Professional Development.

The Strategic Planning Committee has met once in August, overseeing current AMS Strategic Plan Implementation progress. As well discussed, was this year's plan to continue the feasibility and implementation timeline/plan for the AMS KPI System that was begun in 2023/24. Lastly the committee discussed current operations made within the Branding Committee.

For other committees, the Annual Report Editorial Board has met once and seen the formatted draft for the report this year and first round summaries. Additionally, this year's Journal Advisory Board's member that was appointed by the Board of Directors was the Vice-Chair of the Board, Eshal Ali.

Staff Placements & Accommodations

- Human Resources Officer (HRO): Oversaw onboarding for all new staff, ensured completion of required documentation, and began tracking probationary period reviews.

- **Rector Election Policy Review:** the committee has made a great deal of progress and edits to clarify and update important parts of the policy. Due to some in-depth

conversations, we are about 1 meeting behind our initial work schedule. Right now, we are scheduling two more meetings – one to finish the last section and the other to approve everything and include the work. AMS Assembly and SGPS Council can expect to see the proposed changes for final approval at the end of October – beginning of November.

- **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation Working Group:** we have been meeting frequently to plan for programming in September, including an art show in Union Gallery, orange t-shirt distributions, and the Sacred Fire. My Office is leading a project that I look forward to sharing in September and will include participation from AMS Assembly.
